## Friday, October 7 - “WRITE IT and SHOOT IT”

“**Save Your History for the Future**” - learn how to research, organize, write and preserve your family history; presenter University of Idaho history professor and author Dr. Katherine Aiken. **10 a.m.**

“**Through the Camera's Eye**” - College of Idaho archivist/award-winning photographer Jan Boles will share tips on bringing historic architecture to light in the beauty of fall colors; **1 p.m.**

“**Picture Not So Perfect?**” - There is hope for old, dog-eared, faded family photos; learn digital restoration tips from Wallace photographers Indy Behrendt and Lizzie Keitel. **2:30 p.m.**

## Saturday, October 8 - “WALK IT”

“**Mine the Museums**” – walk the downtown with stops at Wallace's three museums to learn a bit about mining, railroading and ladies of the night. **All Day**

“**Pedaling History**” - Learn about the historic bicycle trek of the Buffalo Soldiers. Presenter: author John Langellier. **11 a.m.** Location TBA

“**Climb into History**” - Climb the historic stairs to get an overview of town and participate in a fun stairs event sponsored by the Shoshone Medical Center Foundation. An event for all ages. **1 p.m.**

“**Gone ... but not Forgotten**” - Gather at Nine-Mile Cemetery to learn hidden secrets of this final resting place for miners, military, prostitutes and “prominents.” Civil War re-enactors will conduct a memorial service to dedicate a gravestone for a Civil War veteran whose grave was never marked. **Trolley tours begin at 2 p.m.; Dedication, 3 p.m.**

“**A Step Back in Time in the Silver Valley**” - enjoy an evening show depicting the colorful characters that gave Wallace and the Valley its unique place in Idaho history. **Dinner at 6 p.m.; show at 7 p.m., Nite Rock Event Center. Dinner & show \$30 per person or \$50 per couple; show only, \$20 pp.**

## Sunday, October 9 - “ENJOY IT”

“**Experience the Pulaski**” - Hike to the historic mine tunnel where Ed Pulaski became a hero. Gather at the Trailhead for a short presentation by Pulaski Trail expert Jim See. **10 a.m.**

“**Guided Tours of Historic Bank St.**” Named one of America’s Great Places in 2010 by the American Planning Association, Wallace’s Bank Street serves as a living monument to preserve the region’s and nation’s past. Sponsored in cooperation with the American Planning Association’s American Planning Month. **11am Tours led by Northern Pacific Railway Museum Curator Shauna Hillman.**

“**Home Tours and Hot Tea**” - Tour five historic Wallace homes and two beautiful churches. Top off your tour with light refreshments at the historic Jameson. **Tours every 15 min. Noon to 2:30 p.m. \$20 per person in advance; \$25 at door if space available.**

“**Voices from the Big Burn**” - Actors Paul and Carol Roberts take the stage to recount the story of the historic fire of 1910, through the eyes of the Ed and Emma Pulaski. **4 p.m., Sixth Street Theater, \$10 per person**
